

# GLASS DOORS STYLE GUIDE

## 1 FRAMELESS GLAZING

This structural glass extension to the rear of an existing Victorian manor house gives an open, airy feel, but it is more practical to position the working part of the kitchen below the existing roofline than glazing. This contemporary 'frameless' glass extension by AR Design Studio cost £80,000, while the b3 dark grey aluminium kitchen, by Bulthaup Winchester, is around £38,400, including appliances.



## 2 BALANCED SCHEME

Glass doors can take over visually, so it's always a good idea to include something in your kitchen design that will be equally striking. Here, an entire wall has been given over to a handy expanse of blackboard – great for everything from shopping lists to keeping the kids busy drawing. This extension was designed by Ross Duguid Architecture and constructed by Trust-Build London. Prices for extensions start from £3,000 per square metre. Made from handpainted Shaker-style solid ash cabinetry, this Newport kitchen from Sola Kitchens costs from £18,000, furniture only.



## 3 ALFRESCO FEEL

Concertina doors that fold back fully allow maximum light into this rear extension, enabling the space to host a deep grey kitchen with complementary flooring and dark wood accents. This colour-matched three-door set from 1st Sliding Folding Doors measures (H)350x(W)220cm, £3,960 including installation. This Bovingdon solid oak, oak veneer and tulipwood kitchen is handpainted in Dark Lead by Little Greene. A similar kitchen costs £19,400 at Cue & Co, for cabinetry only.
