## Make it work for you

Bring home a sample door and see how it looks in every part of your kitchen, as greys can look completely different when seen under natural and artificial light.

Use a bold accent colour to give your grey kitchen a more contemporary feel. Try a splashback or a feature wall, or add colourful accessories. Grey works with a number of other colours - from mustard vellows to rusty reds.

If your kitchen is painted, always make sure you ask for a pot of extra paint when it's installed. That way, you can paint over any scratches or marks with a paint you know will match.
